Welcome to the New School Year...



How wonderful it was to see all the children so smart and ready to learn last Tuesday morning – and what a start the children have made to their learning! The school has a wonderfully positive feel with a real excitement about the learning to come this term. A special welcome to Hothfield to our new children and families in Year 3. We hope your children are already enjoying their new school.

We are looking forward to an exciting learning year with lots planned.

Hothfield is growing some wonderful writers. Of the children who left in July, 91% achieved the national writing standard and their progress was 'significantly above' most other children around the country. This year we want to further boost our success in developing children's writing through continuing our focus on poetry to inspire our children to write creatively and develop their wonderful-word skills.

Reading success is rooted in children enjoying great books – so many are inspired to read through the Hothfield Reading Challenge – do keep supporting your child to read these books over the year – perhaps with you! 76% of our Y6 leavers achieved the standard in July (66% of children achieved this across the country).

In maths this year we want to take the children's ability to reason and problem-solve to the next level as well as using motivational, online resources to boost their fluency. We are becoming a centre of excellence for the teaching and learning of maths, supporting schools in our area on their journey toward 'Mastery Maths'. 91% of our Y6 children achieved the standard in July – compared to 70% nationally.


Roald Dahl Day
