# **Hothfield Spelling Bee**

All our children are in training for our first Hothfield Termly Spelling Bee of the year. The children will be tested on their year group's spellings next week and every one they get right will be a point for their class. ## Severe Weather

We had our first bout of severe weather a couple of weeks ago so I thought it was worth making our policy clear: As a rule, we are very reluctant to close the school if there is snow. If there has been a heavy snow fall overnight, then the key issue for deciding whether we could open would be how many of our staff are able to reach the school – many travelling from far afield but we would have a determination to open for children's learning even with a skeleton staff. This decision can usually be made by about 8.00am depending on the weather conditions on that day.

A clear message about whether we are open or not will be on the front page of our website and also available through the Bradford Schools Closure List (access through Google). We will also attempt to text a message. Finding out through our website is much better than phoning-in as we may not have anyone to answer the phone.

We will not close if there is heavy snowfall during the day. However, parents may want to make their own decision to collect their child early from school if they feel they are going to struggle to get them home safely at 3.30pm.

When we do get snowy weather, please ensure your child is sent to school properly equipped so they can enjoy the weather particularly with named wellies or boots and some indoor shoes to change into.

Look out for the Parents Group Christmas raffle – tickets on sale from Monday before and after school... Fantastic prizes!

This is the last newsletter of the term. Please note that the school closes for the Christmas holidays on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December and re-opens for the children on Wednesday, 4<sup>th</sup> January 2017.
