# Supporting Good Causes...

The School Council's non-uniform day supporting Sam Boatwright and his 'epic challenge' to run and cycle across the United States in aid of Help for Heroes raised £178 – thank you for your support.

This year's School Council have chosen to end their year of office with a major 'good cause' fundraiser: They want to raise enough money to buy a defibrillator for the school so if anyone – adult or child – in school or around has a heart attack, the defibrillator will be to hand and could save a life.

We have contacted the West Yorkshire Ambulance Service and they recommend a particular defibrillator for schools which costs around £1000. This is beyond one non-uniform day, so the School Council are going to hold a special sponsored mile event in the last week of term – more details nearer the time.

Encouraging a spirit of enterprise, this is very much an event organised and run by the children. They have already started to think of ideas for stalls - and it looks like we are going to have some interesting ones! We hope that as many parents, grandparents and friends of the school will be able to come along and see what the children have to sell to you...

### Avoiding a Crumpled Heart...

A key part of children's schooling is learning how to get on with one another. We work hard to encourage Hothfielders to treat one another with kindness and respect. Children of this age can slip into name-calling and teasing about anything that they perceive to be different about one another. A running theme in assemblies and in class discussions is that we are all different and difference is good. In each class, there is a 'crumpled heart' pinned to the wall. This is a reminder to all children that if they tease or name-call someone, then it has a bad effect on them - it 'crumples their heart'. Saying sorry or making-up afterwards can help to smooth the crumpled heart back out, but wrinkles will remain. So the positive message for Hothfielders is that difference is good, we should always look to reach out the Hothfield hand of friendship and that name-calling or teasing will always leave a crumpled heart...

### Uniform

Hothfielders are proud to wear their uniform – and very smart they look too. With warmer weather, jumpers tend to be taken off and left around the school – these always find their way back to their owners if they are clearly labelled – do have a look to see if your child's uniform needs re-naming...

Please note that one of the aims of our uniform policy is to keep things simple for our children and so the pressures of fashion do not distract from learning. We have noticed that there have been some quite big and bright headbands and clips being worn. If girls need clips or bands for their hair, please try and keep this simple – and if possible in school colours of red, white, black or grey.

And a reminder to all – our uniform requires black shoes or all black trainers – without prominent logos. Please support the uniform policy by ensuring you provide your child with the right shoes for school...

More news about the new Silsden Primary School uniform coming soon, but please be aware that we have found an organisation who will take old school jumpers for recycling so they do not have to end up in landfill — so please do not throw any away... more news on this for the end of term...
